Haven't made your Snow Crystal block for January's meeting?? Use that downtime after Xmas and put together a gorgeous blue and white block. Note the revision of instructions for step 'B' - Cut one 5 1/4 inch square of medium or dark blue fabric. Cut the square twice diagonally from corner to corner to make four small triangles as needed in step #4.

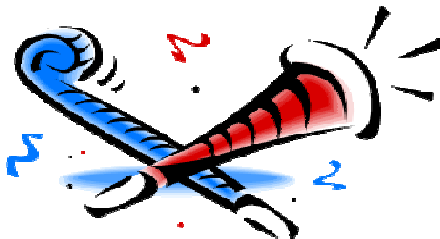

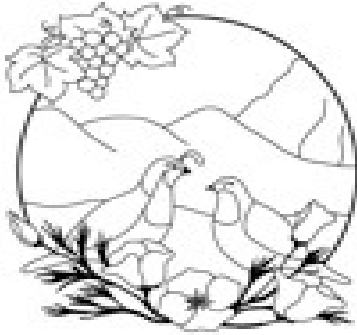
