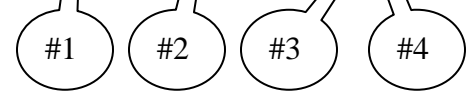
Embracing the Halloween Holiday

Block of the Month: Due October 7, 2009

A lovely block made of simple half-square triangles. The light and dark fabrics embrace the fussy cut square in the center.






Supplies

- Color #1: Dark Halloween print or solid.
- Color #2: Light Halloween print or solid.
- Color #3: Cream solid or reads-as-solid.
- Color #4: Fussy-cut square of Halloween Motif, 4 1/2" square.



Directions

1. Cut three 5" squares of color #1.
2. Cut three 5" squares of color #2.
3. Cut two 5" squares of color #3.
4. Make half-square triangles as follows:

Using two colored squares, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one of the squares.		Draw
Mark a line on 1/4" away from each side of the diagonal.		Draw 1/4" lines
Lay the two squares right sides together. Pin and stitch on lines on each side of diagonal.		Stitch on solid line
Cut apart on the diagonal line and you will have two pieced half-square triangles.		Cut
After pressing, use a square ruler to cut unit 4 1/2" square.		Open triangle and press open

5. Units to make:
 - Dark and light: 4 squares
 - Light and cream: 2 squares
 - Dark and cream: 2 squares
6. Sew in 3 horizontal rows as shown above with fussy cut square in the center.
7. Sew rows together and square to 12 1/2".
