

**May Block of the Month**  
**Moonlight Quilters of Sonoma County**

**Nosegay block – 9 ½” unfinished**

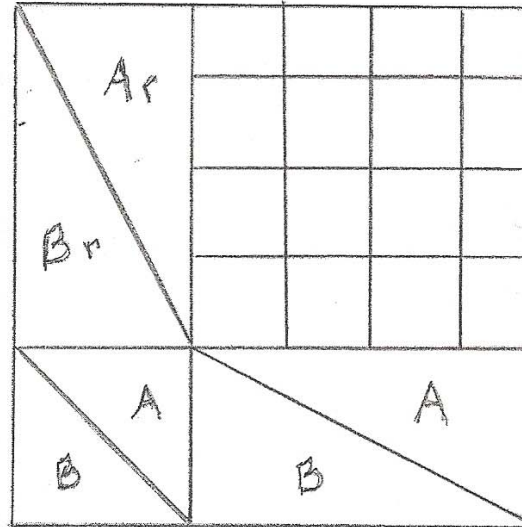
Due: May 6, 2009

A block that can be a hard or as easy as you want to make it. Use assorted floral prints to make up the nosegay. Can use an assortment of 16 small patches, or 4 larger patches, or go to the max with one large floral unit.

For nosegay ‘holder’ – A – your choice of color  
 Cut one 4 ¼” square  
 Cut one A patch (template below)  
 Cut one A reversed patch

Background - B Off-white or cream color  
 Cut one 4 ¼” square  
 Cut one B patch (template below)  
 Cut one B reversed patch

For floral nosegay – choose one method:  
 1. Cut sixteen 2” squares of floral prints, or  
 2. Cut four 3 ½” squares of floral prints, or  
 3. Cut one 6 ½” square of one floral print



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the background 4 ¼” square. Lay the square on top of the other 4 ¼” square, right sides together. Sew a scant ¼” seam on each side of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the penciled line and press open. Trim to 3 ½” square. You will only need to use one of the finished squares for one block.

Sew the floral pieces to make a 6 ½” unit, using whichever method you choose: i.e. #1, or #2, or #3.

Sew A patch to B patch, matching dots. Sew Ar to Br. Attach the ArBr piece to the floral unit. Attach the AB square to AB rectangle piece, then sew to the floral piece.
