#### The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m.

President Linda Lampson declared a quorum, based on the sign-in sheet. In Attendance: President Linda Lampson, Vice-President Denise Ragozzino, Treasurer Michelle Crosbie, Gina Stateler-Calhoun, Teresa Lewis, Mary Flynn. Miriam Marlin, Dena Harding, Karen Derrick, Kathy Vedder, Jeanne Nelson, Patricia Bauer, Pam Brown, Marilyn Lira, Norma Jean Edwards, Trina Jahnsen, Karen Perlis.

The minutes of the June 14 board meeting, as published in the September issue of Patchwords, were unanimously approved as presented.

President's Report: President Lampson noted that we are still looking for a newsletter editor, and to lighten the workload for the editor position, we will be publishing one newsletter to cover July and August, well as one to cover November and December.

Vice-President's Report: Denise had no items to report.

Treasurer's Report: Michelle had no items to report.

Membership: Kathy Vedder reported that approximately 60 people had already renewed their membership. Kathy and Miriam will start calling unpaid members in October, and encouraged everyone to renew their membership using the invoice sent out by the treasurer. She reminded the board that scholarships are readily available to those requesting help.

Programs: Teresa Lewis has programs scheduled for most of the new year. With the addition of Zoom workshop availability, members are encouraged to share recommendations for future programs.

Website: Karen Derrick and Patricia Bauer are constantly working to update and polish our website.

Community Quilts: On behalf of the fire ravaged communities in the mountains around Lake Tahoe, Helaine Campbell has expressed tremendous appreciation for the many quilts we were able to donate at our September business meeting.

Quilt Show: Trina Jahnsen has begun calling subcommittees together and considering possible changes to floor space requirements since we may not have as many vendors, and food service will need to reflect pandemic hygiene protocols.

Ways and Means: Gina Stateler-Calhoun reported that the next Opportunity Quilt is close to being constructed; Karen Bolan is coordinating the assembly. Marketing the current Opportunity Quilt has become quite challenging, given the limited public meeting places available for display. PIQF in mid-October is a huge opportunity to sell tickets to an appreciative public but requires many hours of volunteer time – please sign up!

Meeting Policies: Linda requested feedback about the safety protocols we have put in place for in-person meetings. While the spread-out seating felt somewhat unfriendly, general agreement was that participants felt safe in our space, especially knowing that the doors were to remain open and that a special, robust air purification system was working in the room. The board agreed that certain activities will probably need to be delayed for a while (such as the library) and that going forward, we will require proof of vaccination for people entering the room. MQSC has purchased special additional equipment so that Zoom meetings are still meaningful for those unable to attend in person.

Membership will be responsible for tracking member vaccinations.

Vets Building use – VP Denise will work with the management to apply best practices for our meetings.

In the past, activities such as Medallion sign ups involved many people crowding around the sign- up sheets in our meeting space. To avoid this, Dale and Trina are taking sign-ups by email on September 25 in order to minimize the need for in-person crowding. The website will have all of the medallion starts on display; they will take sign ups in time-stamped order, starting at noon on September 25.

Holiday Celebration – brainstorming session brought up many great ideas. We STILL NEED A COORDINATOR! There will be a gift exchange (this is not a white elephant project). Gifts must be new items and in the \$10-20 range.

Upcoming board dates: Per the constitution, board meetings are to be held in September after the installation of officers, and then in December, March and June after the Quilt Show. Due to the way the calendar has fallen out this year, the next Board meeting will be on November 1.

#### The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
